

New Main Library Building Program Available

The East Baton Rouge Parish Library Board of Control announces that copies of the Library Building Program for the Main Library at Independence Park are now available. Approved by the Board on September 20, the 143 page document outlines major design considerations and details the assignable spaces for the new three-story building, estimated to cost \$30.6 million dollars. The planned 99,735 square foot building includes special areas for children, teens, and adults, meeting rooms and study rooms of various sizes, a quiet reading room, and a computer lab, with ample space for public computers, books, magazines and newspapers, audiobooks, music CDs, videos and DVDs, and reference material.

The adoption of this plan completes the first stage of construction for the new Main Library. In stage two of the construction process, the building program will go to the City-Parish Department of Public Works, which will issue a Request for Qualifications or (RFQ) for the project. The City-Parish Architectural Selection Board will then accept proposals. The Library hopes that the project architect will be selected by the end of the year. Following an estimated 12 months for the design and construction documents and bidding process, it is possible that a groundbreaking for the new Main Library could be held in 2009 with final construction completed by 2011.

These classes vary from basic instruction on Microsoft Word to how to create a résumé. *"We ask the patrons what types of classes they are looking for, and we strive to accommodate their needs."*
