

Overall, in 2017 your East Baton Rouge Parish Library experienced an active year with highly engaged patrons

- The Library was named a Starred Library by Library Journal's "Index of Public Library Service" for the sixth year in a row.
- City Stats reported that the Library earned top ranking in terms of overall satisfaction for government agencies.
- Renovations were completed in the Children's and Adult Section of the Bluebonnet Regional Branch.
- The steel structure for the new River Center Branch was topped off in July.
- The Greenwell Springs Branch, which flooded during the Great Flood of 2016, reopened on March 3, 2017.
- Architects worked on designs to renovate Greenwell Spring Road Regional and Jones Creek Regional Branch libraries.
- The Library's collections continued to grow, with more than 2 million items. Major new additions to the collection included several distinct collections for the BR Room's Archive and special online resources such as *Gale Small Business Builder, Lexis Nexis Legal, Mergent Intellect*, and *Kanopy*. The Library was selected to pilot *The Digital Learn* project by PLA.
- 23,610 new library cards were issued in 2017. The registration database was purged of all cards older than 3 years, bringing the total active patron count to 296,417. VOLUMEN cards remain in use by local school children to access the Digital Library.
- In spite of continuing disruption due to the Great Flood of 2016, circulation remained steady at 2,924,461 items in 2017.

 Digital Circulation accounted for a large percentage of the growth. We piloted new Playaway Audiobooks at two locations.
- The gate count rose slightly to 2,131,182; we are still not at pre-flood levels for visits
- Library staff produced 16,477 Programming events and activities, with approximately 474,185 people participating. Highlights for the year: a year of programming and content creation related to the Baton Rouge Bicentennial; One Book One Community featured *Life on the Mississippi*; the 4th Annual BR Mini-Maker Faire® featured Food Network staff Jay Ducote; the 40th Annual Author Illustrator Program featured Rosemary Wells. A new cohort of children "graduated" from 1000 Books Before Kindergarten and a new partnership with Cradle to K was formed focusing on improving early literacy in the home.
- Reference/information questions slowly rose to normal levels and shifted focus from flood remediation to more usual inquiries.
- The Library began tagging the collection with RFID tags in preparation for new self-check units, gates, and sorting equipment.
- Meeting Room use recorded an estimated 91,554 in attendance with groups using public meeting rooms 6,723 times.
- Study Rooms at Main, Baker, Bluebonnet, Delmont Gardens and Fairwood, were used by more than 52,808 patrons.
- Outreach Service visits recorded 2,125 stops at pre-schools and day care centers, retirement centers, schools, and community events. A new bookmobile for senior centers was delivered in summer 2017; this vehicle replaces the aging ELF bookmobile.
