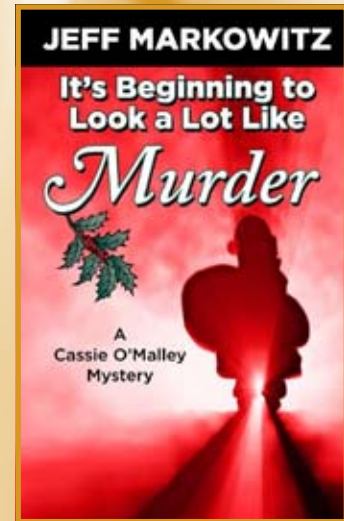


## Murder & Mayhem *at the library*

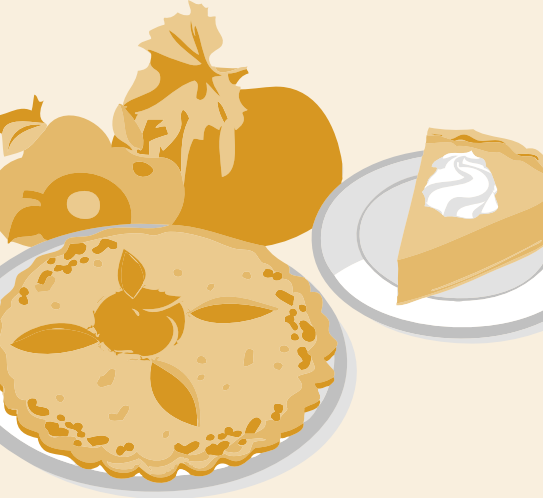


## Live @ Chelsea's
