






### Blake Hicks and daughter, Alina



The Library has always been an important part of Blake Hicks' life. As a young college student, he spent many afternoons in the study rooms and even tutored in the teen area. Blake found the librarians to be very helpful, often going above and beyond to find a resource. If he needed a book and the library didn't have it, the librarians would do an interlibrary loan, or they would try to purchase it for him.

Once Blake's daughter Alina was born, the Library took on a new role. When Alina was about two years old, Blake wanted to find something educational to do with his daughter. "We would go to multiple branches such as Main, Bluebonnet, and Carver to attend their storytimes, and one librarian mentioned the 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program." Although 1,000 books seemed like a lot at first, Blake decided to accept the challenge with his daughter to encourage positive educational habits. They started reading in the summer of 2021 and completed the program in about 18 months. Even once they reached the set goal of 1,000 books,

they continued reading together each night out of habit.

Blake believes that when you read with your child nightly, you are building a positive bond and creating memories with them that they will cherish forever. He recommends to any parent or caregiver interested in the 1,000 Books program, "Sign up today and get started! The Library does a great job of allowing you to check out a lot of books at a time, and they no longer charge fines, so you don't have to worry about bringing the book back right away if your child falls in love with it." Blake wants parents to understand that they must put in the effort to foster learning in their child's life.

While going through the program Blake was inspired to write his own book, Squeezing Success. "As we were participating in the 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program, I realized what kind of books that my daughter liked and didn't like, so based on that, I wrote Squeezing Success." Blake penned his book with dads in mind as a way to encourage them to spend time with their kids in a fun, educational way. *Squeezing Success* is a story within a story because while he is encouraging parents to read with their children, the book also teaches kids how to run a business.







The overall visitor Gate Count rose to 1,704,452.

### An increase of 9.74%

Staff report that people are staying longer and taking advantage of more services when they visit.

The Library issued 27,449 new library cards in 2023.

The total Patron Count increased to 337,943 or 74 % of the parish population.

Over 1/3 of these patrons had used their cards within the last 12 weeks.



# **Engagement and Activity**

### **Overall Circulation is up 8%.**

Digital circulation comprised a significant portion of the total circulation of 2,769,116 with more than 1.2 million downloads.

Many "digital" patrons are returning in-person for physical items.

The Library increased the collections of the Library of Things with more circulating Wi-Fi Hotspots, Games, and Family Activity Kits.

725 Wi-Fi 2 Geaux Hotspots were checked out 5,332 times in 2023.



# **Special Literacy Projects**

Continuing its focus on literacy, a new cohort of children "graduated" from 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten, which enrolled 646 new participants and logged 49,496 books.

The Reading is Elementary program enrolled **511** children, and the Literacy Calendar has expanded to Spanish.

Beanstack's virtual Summer Reading Club platform extended activities throughout the year.

Staff presented 2,392 storytimes to almost 53,000 attendees.

The Press Start! Ready, Set, Read! Initiative continued at all branches.

Library staff continued the Home Library Pilot Project working with at-risk 3rd graders at six schools.


# **Information and Access**

This year, there were 878,095 Reference/Information questions, reflecting the ability for patrons to come in person to any location to ask for assistance or self-serve.





Recording 919,008 logins, the Library's Wi-Fi usage showed modest gains of 2.3%. Wi-Fi was enhanced throughout the system.
