

SoleLab Hip Hop Festival



Saturday, July 15 at 1 p.m. – You're invited to an awe-inspiring chat with *New York Times* bestselling author Charles Soule about his newest book, *The Endless Vessel*, which explores the way we're all connected—and what can happen when we lose our capacity for joy. *The Endless Vessel* transports us to a few years from now, in a world similar to ours, where there exists a sort of "depression plague" that people refer to simply as "The Grey." A young Hong Kong-



based scientist, Lily Barnes, is trying to maintain her inner light in an increasingly dark world. One day, Lily comes across something that seems to be addressing her directly, calling to her, asking her to follow a path to whatever lies at its end. Is this the Endless Vessel that leads to happiness? Charles Soule artfully channels history, science, and drama to create a story for the ages—a story of hope and love, and possibility.

Thursday, July 20 at Noon – The most important conversation we have each day isn't with our boss, spouse, or friends: it's the one we have with ourselves. When facing a challenging task, our inner voice can motivate us and help us keep our focus. But often, we come up against the nagging voice that tells us we can't do it or that people will laugh at us if we try. The million-dollar question is how can we transform our self-saboteur, determined to



undermine our success, into an internal life coach that will buoy us up and help us expand our potential? Enter Ethan Kross. A world-class psychological scientist, Kross has written one of modern history's most definitive guides to mastering self-talk. In *Chatter*, he uses a blend of cutting-edge science (from his own lab) and real-world case studies to help us harness the power of our inner voice. An expert storyteller, Kross brings his research to life in a way that is fascinating, accessible, and immediately applicable to our daily lives.

Tuesday, July 25 at 3 p.m. – Join us as we chat with award-winning writer Erika Sánchez about her utterly original, moving, and disarmingly funny memoir-in-essays *Crying in the Bathroom*. Growing up as the daughter of Mexican immigrants in Chicago in the nineties, Erika Sánchez was a self-described pariah, misfit, and disappointment—a foul-mouthed, melancholic rabble-rouser who painted her nails black but also loved comedy, often



laughing so hard with her friends that she had to leave her school classroom. Twenty-five years later, she's now an award-winning novelist, poet, and essayist, but she's still got an irrepressible laugh, an acerbic wit, and singular powers of perception about the world around her. Raunchy, insightful, unapologetic, and brutally honest, *Crying in the Bathroom* is Sánchez's best—a book that will make you feel that post-confessional high that comes from talking for hours with your best friend.

E-cigarettes (vapes) harm not only the consumer's health but are considered hazardous waste for two key reasons: nicotine and battery content.

Nicotine is toxic to humans if consumed or absorbed through the skin or lungs, but it can also poison wildlife and pollute our soil and water. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) labels liquid nicotine 'an acute hazardous waste,' meaning the vapes that contain liquid nicotine cannot simply be thrown away into the trash or worse discarded as litter.

Batteries in vapes improperly disposed corrode and metals and chemicals. like lithium - leak into the ground and pollute our soil and water. They can also cause fires in our ground, the garbage and recycling trucks and lancifills. Not recycling batteries is a massive waste of lithium and other materials that could be reused. When batteries aren't recycled, more destructive lithium mining occurs.

- Never throw used e-cigarette items into the trash. Store all vape items in a cool, dry container labeled for hazardous waste and deliver to a local hazardous waste facility.
- Do not ifnse e-cigarette spent cartridges to remove the liquid nicotine residue. That water will become hazardous waste.
- Handle used cartridges carefully to avoid unintentional exposure to unused nicotine as it can be absorbed through the skin and cause accidental poisoning.
- Check with your state and local environmental agencies for rules and guidance about e-cigarette and e-liquid waste disposal
