began in 2016 and about half of the players are members of St. Alban's Chapel where they practice weekly.



**Tuesday, August 15 at 3 p.m.** – All are welcome and encouraged to join us for an engaging hour online with *New York Times* bestselling



Wednesday, August 23 at 7 p.m. – Join us for an exciting evening online as we chat with mega-bestselling author, Cassandra Clare, about



Artichokes, Exploding Kittens, and Sushi Go! Patrons may check out three games at a time. Just bring the games


