Artist and teacher Evelina Lundqvist was born and raised in Sweden, where art is a mandatory school subject until 8th grade. "I've always loved creating things," she recalled. But around the time she entered the U.S. equivalent of high school, Evelina felt uninspired and lost interest in drawing. "I didn't see myself improving. Usually, when you create something, all you can see are the flaws." Her journey might have ended right then and there had Evelina not taken a class with Bulgarian artist Krassimir Kolev who saw potential in her and helped her see beyond her flaws. She thought, "This must be a gift. I saw a sign that this is what I'm supposed to do." She went on to study at Oral Roberts University and

received an MA in Fine Art at UCA Canterbury in 2015. She taught art in Sweden for 6 vears before moving to Louisiana with her family in 2022.

"I absolutely love it here," she smiled, long golden locks framing her cheery face. She was not only referring to Baton Rouge, but also the Bluebonnet Regional Branch Library and its spectacular

Makerspace—her crafting room away from home. Evelina was delighted to have access to a Lulzbot Mini 3D Printer, and all she needed was her



As required by ACT 436, the East Baton Rouge Parish Library is now issuing new library cards for ALL minor children aged 0-17. You may update the card status at your convenience at any library location.

Parents must choose between several card categories:

- Current, Standard Card
- Computer Use Only Card
- Restricted Card AKA "Bookshelf" Card
- Unrestricted Card AKA "Explore" Card

In order to keep your child's current card active as a Standard Card, a Computer Use Only Card, OR as a STUDENT eCard, parents or guardians may simply contact the Circulation Department at cardmaintenance@ebrpl.com to indicate this approved status. No new plastic card is required. A form is also available on the website at ebrpl.com/parentalconsent, as well as more information about each type of card.

In order to switch to either the new Restricted or Unrestricted status, parents or guardians must come in to the Library of your choice with their minor child and complete a new application; parents should present a photo ID and proof of current address to Circulation staff at that time.
