Tuesday, February 4 at 1 p.m. – Join us for this enlightening presentation with Smithsonian curator Sabrina Sholts as she talks about how the very fact of being human increases our pandemic risks—and gives us the power to save ourselves. The COVID-19 pandemic won't be our last—because what makes us vulnerable to pandemics also makes us human. That is the uncomfortable but all-too-timely message of *The Human Disease: How We Create Pandemics, From Our Bodies to Our Beliefs,* which travels through history and around the globe to examine how and why pandemics are an inescapable threat of our own making. Weaving together a wealth of personal experiences, scientific findings,




and historical stories, Sholts brings dramatic and much-needed clarity to one of the most profound challenges we face as a species. Though the COVID-19 pandemic looms large in Sholts's account, it is, in fact, just one of the many infectious disease events explored in *The Human Disease*. By recognizing our risks, Sholts suggests that we can take actions to reduce them.

Tuesday, February 11 at 6 p.m. – You're invited to a riveting conversation with bestselling author Waubgeshig Rice to chat about his newest book, *Moon of the Turning Leaves*, the hotly anticipated sequel to the bestselling novel *Moon of the Crusted Snow*. It's been over a decade since a mysterious cataclysm caused a permanent blackout that toppled infrastructure and thrust the world into anarchy. Evan Whitesky led his community in remote northern Ontario off the rez and into the bush, where they've been living off the land, rekindling their Anishinaabe traditions in total isolation from the outside world. As new generations are born and others come of age, Evan's people are in some ways stronger



than ever. But resources in and around their new settlement are beginning to dry up, and the elders warn that they cannot afford to stay indefinitely. Evan and his fifteen-year-old daughter, Nangohns, are elected to lead a small scouting party on a months-long trip to their traditional home on the north shore of Lake Huron to seek new beginnings and discover what kind of life—and what dangers—still exist in the lands to the south.

Tuesday, February 18 at 1 p.m. – We welcome you to our conversation with journalist and author Lee Hawkins as he talks to us about the examination of his family's legacy of post-enslavement trauma and resilience in this riveting memoir, *I Am Nobody's Slave: How Uncovering My Family's History Set Me Free.* This book examines how trauma from enslavement and Jim Crow shaped their outlook on thriving in America, influenced each generation, and how they succeeded despite these challenges. To their suburban Minnesotan neighbors, the Hawkinses were an ideal American family, embodying strength and success. However, behind closed doors, they faced the legacy of enslavement and apartheid.



Hawkins explores the role of racism-triggered childhood trauma and chronic stress in shortening his ancestors' lives, using genetic testing, reporting, and historical data to craft a moving family portrait. This book shows how genealogical research can educate and heal Americans of all races, revealing through their story the story of America—a journey of struggle, resilience, and the heavy cost of ultimate success.

Libraries Change Lives

We all deserve to know where we come from.

These aren't empty words to Regina Bergeron. They speak of a mission to bring knowledge and connection to families through the power of genealogy.

Her interest in family history first piqued back in 2012 when her aunt showed her some information she had gathered about their ancestors. But it

was a project related to her workplace that sparked a passion for researching the past. Regina works as a chemical engineer at BASF, and on the BASF Geismar property is the site of the former Linwood Plantation. In 2020, she and a colleague began researching Linwood, especially the enslaved people who lived there. Regina came to the Main

Library at Goodwood for help.

Library staff member Jan Day helped kickstart this genealogical journey. "Jan pointed me to an 1859 document detailing the sale of the plantation. From there, we visited the Ascension Parish courthouse and learned the



names of 129 enslaved individuals. We were excited to learn their names, but it was bittersweet to find out that they were listed on the sale alongside cattle and farm equipment," lamented Regina. Although the history of African Americans is difficult to research, she was determined to memorialize these human beings who lived in bondage

and died without proper headstones marking their final resting places. According to tradition, enslaved people would often plant periwinkle flowers at gravesites; thus, the "Periwinkle Project" was born.

Regina learned so much helpful information about the people at Linwood, but soon she was ready to dive into

her own family's history. So back to the Library she went! This time, she received specialized assistance from

Genealogy Librarian David Laatsch. Regina explains, "David was my right hand. He found census records and marriage licenses, and also introduced me to the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture at the New York Public Library." With David's help, she has traced her family back for five generations and has 3,067 people on her family tree (so far)! In her research, she found ancestors of both African and European descent; she reached out to both sides and has been lovingly

welcomed into the family by everyone! She's made lasting connections with "new" family members, even spending holidays with them and helping to plan family reunions.

Regina will give a presentation on "Project Periwinkle" at the Main Library at Goodwood in March. Come learn more about her amazing ancestry adventure and her desire to help others start theirs!

When asked how this journey has changed her, Regina shared, "It has made me more open-minded. I'm a complex individual with a complex family history. It's powerful when you know who you are."

As required by ACT 436, the East Baton Rouge Parish Library is now issuing new library cards for ALL minor children aged 0-17. You may update the card status at your convenience at any Library location.

Parents must choose between several card categories:

- Current, Standard Card
- Computer Use Only Card
- Restricted Card AKA "Bookshelf" Card
- Unrestricted Card AKA "Explore" Card

In order to keep your child's current card active as a Standard Card, a Computer Use Only Card, OR as a STUDENT eCard, parents or guardians may simply contact the Circulation Department at cardmaintenance@ebrpl. com to indicate this approved status. No new plastic card is required. A form is also available on the website at ebrpl. com/parentalconsent, as well as more information about each type of card.

In order to switch to either the new Restricted or Unrestricted status, parents or guardians must come into the Library of your choice with their minor child and complete a new application; parents should present a photo ID and proof of current address to Circulation staff at that time.






