





Thankfully, her works withstood the culture wars, and it's no coincidence that Blume has resurfaced as a cultural touchstone.

Libraries Change Lives

ike so many, Charles Daniel's life was upended in 2005 by Hurricane Katrina. However, he didn't flee New Orleans; he moved there. As a Baton Rouge native with a degree in ISDS from LSU, he originally relocated to NOLA to help his grandmother rebuild her home after the catastrophic storm, then began working as a tech auditor for local businesses in the area. Charles explained, "I loved helping companies cut costs and save money, but often, due to my audit, employees were laid off and replaced with tech alternatives. That started to weigh on me. I didn't like being the bad guy."

To counteract the stress of his job, Charles started biking around the city at night with several friends. By 2015, the group had grown to between 500-1,000 cyclists on any given night and is still currently active in New Orleans.

But after the flood of 2016, Charles came back home to Baton Rouge, once again heading toward the devastation to offer help and hope. He started with 10 bikes in a travel trailer and led guided tours of the downtown area. "During this time, people needed an outlet to maintain a positive physical, and especially mental, well-being," shared Charles.



In December 2019, he opened his brick-and-mortar location, GeauxRide, on Third Street in downtown Baton Rouge. This proved fortuitous as the Covid lockdown of 2020-21 made it even more important for Baton Rouge citizens to get outside, reconnect with friends, and focus on health and wellness. "During the lockdown, we were the

only business open downtown at night. Because biking is an outdoor activity, people were excited to have something to do. They could get some exercise and also maybe see their city in a different light."

As Charles continued to seek new ways to run and grow his business, he learned about the Library's Small Business Services in 2023 and made

an appointment with Business Librarian Austin Langley. After meeting with Austin, he was amazed at the number of free resources available to small business owners through the Library, some which would have cost him thousand of dollars to access personally. "At first, I didn't even know what to ask," admitted Charles, "but Austin met me where I was. He was instrumental in gathering market research data, providing business demographics, producing a financial analysis, and helping me to build a solid business plan."

What does the future look like for Geaux Ride? Charles hopes to open two more locations in the near future, adding retail bikes and apparel. He also plans to ramp up community outreach efforts, including bike-riding lessons and bicycle giveaways at Christmas. "I want to continue to encourage a renewed interest in biking around Baton Rouge. I know the Library's resources will help me do just that."

Student Library Card Update

As required by ACT 436, the East Baton Rouge Parish Library is now issuing new library cards for ALL minor children aged 0-17. You may update the card status at your convenience at any Library location.

Parents must choose between several card categories:

- Current, Standard Card
- Computer Use Only Card
- Restricted Card AKA "Bookshelf" Card
- Unrestricted Card AKA "Explore" Card

In order to keep your child's current card active as a Standard Card, a Computer Use Only Card, OR as a STUDENT eCard, parents or guardians may simply contact the Circulation Department at cardmaintenance@ebrpl.com to indicate this approved status. No new plastic card is required. A form is also available on the website at ebrpl.com/parentalconsent, as well as more information about each type of card.

In order to switch to either the new Restricted or Unrestricted status, parents or guardians must come into the Library of your choice with their minor child and complete a new application; parents should present a photo ID and proof of current address to Circulation staff at that time.



Blood Pressure Monitoring Kits Now at Carver and Eden Park

Patrons can now check out blood pressure monitors at the Carver and Eden Park Branches through the "Libraries with Heart" program, launched in partnership with the American Heart Association and sponsored by CareSouth Medical and Dental. Each kit includes a monitor, instructions for proper use, health literature, and a list of local health resources.

The two new locations join the Delmont Gardens Branch in also providing tabletop blood pressure machines for use while in the Library as well as the circulating monitors. 





The gallery occupies a historic 1927 pool house that once served as a segregated swimming facility in BREC's City Park and features a diverse range of media including painting, sculpture, digital art, and film done by over 50 artist members.

BREC's Bluebonnet Swamp Nature Center - A 103-acre conservation area featuring over a mile of trails and boardwalks that wind through diverse habitats, including cypress-tupelo swamps and hardwood forests, it offers visitors a chance to observe native wildlife such as birds, turtles, snakes, and occasionally otters and deer. The center's 9,500-square-foot building houses live animal displays, educational exhibits on local flora and fauna, and a notable collection of vintage waterfowl decoys. Guided tours and special events are offered for those looking for structure, or one can simply walk through the native wildlife at their own pace.

LSU Rural Life Museum – An outdoor museum within the Burden Museum and Gardens that features homes and buildings built in the 18th and 19th Century, the Rural Life Museum gives visitors a glimpse into the lives of various classes and cultures that have existed in Louisiana throughout the centuries.




